## **Toilet block for Bright Children of Angkor School**





High on the 'wish list' for the BCA School near Siem Reap, Cambodia, has been a toilet block. We are happy to report that through Christmas 2009 donations from 'friends of Humanitus' and the fundraising efforts of Melbourne Grammar School (Grimwade House), construction of the toilets has been completed. This will make an enormous difference not only to the lives of the children but also the residents of Makak Village. Cambodia's rural sanitation coverage is less than 16% and is amongst the lowest in the world. Diarrheal diseases are the number one cause of sickness and death amongst Cambodian children, with 20% of children under 5 year's old suffering from diarrhea. The health impact due to poor sanitation and hygiene result in an estimated 12,000 deaths per year. ## **Humanitus at work in Sumatra**





Angus and Celine have been very busy at the Lontung School in Sumatra these past couple of months. Recent donations have made possible many much needed changes. The Lontung School now has electricity and has undergone a major face lift. Buildings have been painted, resources such as maps etc have been purchased and trees are being planted in the school yard. A clean water supply is essential and guttering for water catchment and a water tank are now being installed. The school has a 'techno savvy' teacher and we will shortly be supplying a computer for the school. Many of the children have to row 2hours to get to school and are exhausted before their learning day has started. At least now when they arrive they have a more inspirational environment to learn in. Many of the children are malnourished and in a general bad state of health. Next on our list is a health and sanitation program including meals and vitamin supplements.
